

Alabama lawmakers allocate \$11 million for youth behavioral health services

Gov. Kay Ivey announced Friday that Alabama lawmakers set aside \$11 million in the recently passed budgets for behavioral health services for Medicaid-eligible children and youth.

That funding is aimed at expanding community and home-based services offered by the Alabama Department of Mental Health for children and youth with severe emotional disturbance and those with autism spectrum disorder.
