



Alabama Behavior Analyst Licensing Board Board Member Application Information

As noted in Section 34-5A-3 of the Code of Alabama (1975), the Alabama Behavior Analyst Licensing Board (ABALB) consists of seven (7) members, including four (4) licensed behavior analysts, one (1) licensed psychologist in the state, one (1) parent or legal guardian of a person being treated for a behavior disorder or a person who has received services from a licensed behavior analyst, and one (1) public member who is a person who is not and never was a member of any profession licensed or regulated under the Board, or the spouse of such person, and a person who does not have and never has had a material interest in the practice of behavior analysis. Each member serves a 3-year term. The membership of the board shall be inclusive and reflect the racial, gender, geographic, urban/rural, and economic diversity of the state. The Governor will appoint new board members based on the board's recommendations.

Applications for the following position are due November 1, 2018:

- One (1) License Behavior Analyst to serve from 2019 through 2021
- Expected duties include but are not limited to:
 - Read and abide by the Board's statutes and rules
 - Attend and participate in quarterly board meetings in January, April, July/August, & October
 - 2019 meeting dates: January 25, April 19, July 26, and October 25
 - These meetings are typically held in Birmingham, but may also be held in Montgomery. Board members receive a small per diem for the meeting day and mileage reimbursement to/from the meeting.
 - Offer knowledge and be willing to learn more about:
 - The status and needs of the practice of behavior analysis in Alabama
 - Best practices in applied behavior analysis
 - State regulation practices
